

## **User Guide on Embedding Campaign Widgets**


### 1. Introduction

We kindly ask you to embed the widgets of our campaign into your website. The idea of a "widget" is straightforward: it is a small piece of software run with Javascript. The software is used on a page of a website to give the user changing information (in our case the number of signatories).

We have already produced the widget. There are two versions:

**The Embedded version** = the widget you see directly on a site including the text of thepetition and the fields to sign the petition, see below.

**The Popup widget** is the one you place on a homepage or somewhere else. This widget links to the embedded one when you click on "take action."


## 2. How to embed a widget into your website

Every website is different. Whilst some use still good-old html code to build their websites, you are most likely using a "content-management-system" (CMS) to update your website. Usually, you can simply place the code between other texts – simply paste it into a page or new article.

## **Example:**

Democracy International's website is run with Drupal. Here you need to change the editor of your Content Management System to **source code**.

Then insert the jaca script code into the source code, for English the code of the widget is: <script type="text/javascript" src="https://www.policat.org/api/js/widget/4720"></script>



In some content management systems, such as wordpress, you simply add a "HTML-box" from your plug-in repository. Then go into "Options" or "Settings" or "Content" of this HTML-box and paste your widget code there. Once done, you can place the HTML-box whereever your widget should appear on your website.

**Note:** Your CMS system must allow you to use html/javascript. If it doesn't work in the first place, ask your web administrator to change settings of your CMS system.
