Dear members and friends of Democracy International,

Yesterday, on the day of Santa Clause, my colleague Klaus Hofmann arrived back in our office after travelling Ecuador, Peru, Chile, Uruguay and Brazil for two months. He visited South America to learn about the current state of politics and direct democracy in these countries.

On a European scale and for a much shorter time, I am back from a three-day-conference in Toulouse, France. There I was the only one who spoke out for direct democracy, while others talked about representative democracy during the crisis and citizens' inclusion in the budgetary planning of municipalities in France, Germany and Great Britain. The conference on "Participation and Democracy" was organized by the Goethe-Institut Toulouse.

The conference demonstrated that the topic of "participation" is en vogue at the moment, though this does not necessarily mean more direct democracy. In Europe there need to be more bottom-up initiatives of direct democracy, this is also one of the conclusions Klaus Hofmann drew from his journey through South America.

All this shows the importance of steering our ideas into the mainstream of political thinking and to continue our work in 2013. In the meantime the board and staff of Democracy International wish you a good Christmas time and peaceful festivities.
